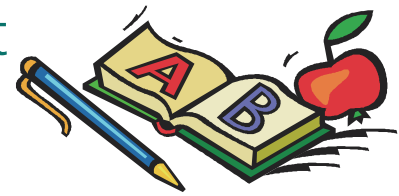

To measure a patient's progress during rehabilitation treatment, it is necessary to use a standard rating scale. The scale used most frequently is the Functional Independence Measurement (FIM). It measures the patient's level of independence in several areas, and the total score is used to measure patient outcomes. The FIM scale gives professionals an accurate way to communicate patient needs, set goals for treatment and measure gains made by the patient. Additionally, it helps the rehabilitation unit measure its success with all patients treated. This report card is to communicate the outcomes produced at Southwest General.
